Amb. Jeremy Issacharoff Ambassador of Israel to Germany



Brig. Gen. Dror Shalom Head, Research and Analysis Division (RAD), Inteligence, Israel Defense Forces (IDF)

Amb. Jeremy Issacharoff has been Ambassador for the state of Israel in Germany since August 2017. He has been a diplomat in Israel's Foreign Service since 1980 and served among other roles as the vice director general and head of the Multilateral Affairs Directorate in the Israeli Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) from 2014 to 2017, and deputy chief of mission to the Israeli embassy in Washington D.C. Between 2003 and 2008, Amb. Issacharoff was asked by the United Nations Secretary General to serve on his Advisory Board for Disarmament Affairs. He was Israel's first deputy director general for strategic affairs in the Foreign Ministry, established to cope with politico-military affairs in the post 9/11 world. He is considered an expert on Iran and in US strategic relations and had a central role in the negotiations with the EU on the European Neighborhood Policy Agreement in 2004 and in expanding contacts with NATO. Amb. Issacharoff graduated from the London School of Economics with an LLB and MSc in international relations.

Brig. Gen. Dror Shalom is the Head of the Research and Analysis Division in the Israeli Defense Intelligence. He has served in several key positions in the Israeli Defense Intelligence in the Israel Defense Forces. He served as a special advisor to the Chief of Israel Defense Intelligence as well as the deputy for analysis in the RAD. In his previous position he served as Chief Instructor in the Israeli National Defense College and as a research fellow in the College. Brig. Gen. Shalom has a BA in Middle Eastern studies & history of the land of Israel from Tel Aviv University, an LLB from the Interdisciplinary Center (IDC), a legal training in international law, an IDF Military Advocate International Law, and an Executive MBA from Tel Aviv University.

Dr. Ralf Brauksiepe Parliamentary State Secretary at the Federal Ministry of Defense



Dr. Ole Diehl Vice President, Bundesnachrichtendienst

Dr. Ralf Brauksiepe is Parliamentary State Secretary at the German Ministry of Defense since December 2013. Between 2009 and 2013, he held the same position at the German Ministry of Labor and Social Affairs. Since 2009, Dr. Brauksiepe is Deputy Chairman of the CDU/CSU (Christian Democratic Party/Christian Social Union) parliamentary group of North Rhine-Westphalia in the German Bundestag, where he is member of the CDU/CSU party group already since 1998. He is member of the Federal Executive Board of the CDU and Federal Chairman of the Christian Democratic Workers 'Association (CDA). Before his political career, he was research assistant at the Faculty of Economics at Bochum University. Dr. Ralf Brauksiepe has a MA in Economics from Bochum University and got his PhD in 1995.

Dr. Ole Diehl is Vice President of Bundesnachrichtendienst (Intelligence) since 2016. Before that, he was serving as Consular General in Mazar-e Sharif, Afghanistan. From 2009 to 2014, Dr. Diehl was posted at the headquarter of the Federal Foreign Office, heading the Central Europe Division, the office of Minister of State Prof. Dr. Maria Böhmer and the parliament and cabinet division. Since the beginning of his career as a diplomat, he has been assigned to various missions in New Zealand, the United States of America as well as providing council to German Parliament and the Federal President. Dr. Diehl studied political science, public law and Slavic studies in Kiel and completed his PhD at the Free University of Berlin.



Special Keynote



Volker Bouffier Prime Minister of the State of Hessen

Mr. Volker Bouffier is Prime Minister of the State of Hessen since August 2010. After elections in 2013, for the first time in Germany, he started a blackgreen coalition (CDU-Alliance 90/the Greens) in a German federal state. During this time, he also was President of the Bundesrat from November 2014 to October 2015. Before he became Prime Minister of Hessen, he was Minister of the Interior and Sport in Hessen until 2010. Besides his positions as a minister, he has been chairman of the Hessian CDU since July 2010 and one of the five deputy party heads of the federal CDU since November 2010. From 1987 to 1991, he worked as undersecretary at the Ministry of Justice of Hessen and held different other political positions. He is a lawyer by training and gained his state examination at law in 1977 at the University of Giessen. Hessen is one of the most important economic German partner for Israel, e.g. having a partnership in cyber-security between the Hebrew University Jerusalem and the Fraunhofer Institute for Secure Information Technology, the leading institute for applied cybersecurity research in Germany, based in Hessen.

MK Rachel Azaria Member, Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee



MK Omer Barlev Member, Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee

MK Rachel Azaria represents the Kulanu party in the 20th Knesset, ranking fifth on the party list. She was recently appointed the chair of the Knesset Reforms Committee, serves as a member of the Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee, the Finance Committee, and the Ethics Committee. She is identified by her liberal-social approach and her opposition to religious legislation by other coalition members, particularly bills that undermine the status quo. Before entering the Knesset, MK Azaria headed Mavoi Satum, which provides legal counseling and support to women who have been refused a Jewish bill of divorce. Between 2008 and 2013, she served as a member of the Jerusalem City Council. In 2013, MK Azaria was appointed Deputy Mayor of Jerusalem. In addition, she was one of the initiators of the establishment of an Orthodox Kashrut supervision – an alternative to the Rabbinate - Hashgacha Pratit. MK Azaria holds a BA in psychology and an MA in conflict resolution from Hebrew University Jerusalem.

MK Omer Barley was first elected to the 19th Knesset in 2013 as a member of the Israeli Labor Party and was reelected to the 20th Knesset in 2015. MK Barlev is member of the Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee, heading the Subcommittee for Military Readiness and Routine Security, and member in other subcommittees, including the subcommittees on intelligence and cyber. Prior to his political career he enjoyed a long career mainly in the Israeli medical hi-tech industry. MK Barlev was appointed the commander of the IDF's Special Forces in 1984. He also served as a member of the IDF's delegation for the negotiations between Israel and the PLO and afterwards took part in negotiating the peace agreement with Jordan (1994). He holds a BSc in agronomy from the Hebrew University Jerusalem and a MA in international relations and strategy from Tel Aviv University. After the assassination of Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin, MK Barlev founded the movement Acharai, which has become one of the biggest and most successful Israeli youth organizations.



Eran Etzion Executive Director, Forum of Strategic Dialogue (FSD)

Eran Etzion is executive director of the Forum of Strategic Dialogue (FSD). He is a former diplomat who held senior positions, including the head of policy planning at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, and deputy head of the National Security Council in the Prime Minister's office. He has extensive experience in the fields of strategy, policy planning and diplomatic execution across all dimensions of national and international security. Mr. Etzion has led strategic and policy planning dialogues between Israel and its major international counterparts including the US, China, Russia, France, Britain, and Germany. He is currently involved in a number of start-up ventures in the fields of strategy and clean technologies. Mr. Etzion holds a BA in philosophy and Far Eastern studies from the Hebrew University, and an MBA from the University of Phoenix.



Dr. Amichai Magen

Senior Lecturer, Lauder School of Government, Diplomacy and Strategy; Head, Governance & Political Violence Program, ICT, IDC, Herzliya

Dr. Amichai Magen is a senior lecturer (US Associate Professor) and head of the MA program in diplomacy & conflict studies at the Lauder School of Government, Diplomacy and Strategy. He also heads the governance & political violence program at the Institute for Counter-Terrorism (ICT), and is a visiting fellow at the Hoover Institution, Stanford University. Between 2005 and 2009, he was a lecturer in law at Stanford Law School, and a research fellow at the Center on Democracy, Development and the Rule of Law (CDDRL) at the Freeman Spogli Institute for International Studies (FSI). Dr. Magen received the Yitzhak Rabin Fulbright Award (2003) and the National Fellow Award from Hoover Institution. In 2016. he was named Richard von Weizsäcker Fellow by the Robert Bosch Academy. Dr. Magen is a member of the Board of Directors of the Israel Council on Foreign Relations.



Shimrit Meir CEO, Link – the Center for Strategic Communication in the Middle East



Barak Ravid Senior Diplomatic Correspondent, *Channel 10 News*

Shimrit Meir is the CEO of Link – the Center for Strategic Communication in the Middle East. She is a leading Middle East analyst and longtime journalist with more than 15 years of experience researching and covering the Arab world, and the Palestinians in particular. She is also the founding editor of Israel's largest Arabic media outlet Al-Masdar. Fluent in Arabic, Hebrew, English and French, Ms. Meir was the Arab affairs correspondent and commentator for Galei Zahal, one of Israel's top news channels, and worked for both Israeli public television and for Channel 2 News, the country's largest commercial station. Based in Tel Aviv, Ms. Meir heads a Jewish-Arab team of young journalists that delivers stories from Israel to the Arab world, using web and social media platforms. The team has a facebook community of more than 2.2 million people across the region and operates a highly popular news website.

Barak Ravid is the Senior Diplomatic Correspondent of Channel 10 News. He joined Channel 10 News in October 2017. Mr. Ravid is covering the Prime Minister's Office, the Foreign Ministry and the Ministry of Defense, dealing with issues such as U.S.-Israeli relations, EU-Israeli relations and the peace process. Before joining Channel 10 News, he worked for 10 years as diplomatic correspondent for Haaretz newspaper. Before joining Haaretz, Mr. Ravid worked for two years for Maariv daily newspaper, spending a year covering the Palestinian Authority and a year as a diplomatic correspondent. Mr. Ravid has a BA in the history of the Middle East from the University of Tel Aviv. He served for six years as an officer in the Israel Defense Forces and concluded his service with the rank of Captain.





Dr. Dan Schueftan Director, National Security Studies Center, University of Haifa

Dr. Dan Schueftan is director of the National Security Studies Center at the University of Haifa, a lecturer at the Israel Defense Forces National Defense College and was a Goldman Visiting Professor between 2012 and 2014 at the Department of Government at Georgetown University. For the last four decades, he has been a consultant to Israeli decision makers and to the top echelon of Israel's Prime Minister's Office, Foreign Ministry, Defense Ministry and the National Security Council. He has also been briefing senior members of the executive branch, legislators, political leaders, senior officers, defense and intelligence officials and government advisors in the United States and Europe since the 1970s.



Amb. Shimon Stein Research Fellow, Institute for National Security Studies (INSS); former Ambassador of Israel to Germany

Amb. Shimon Stein is currently a research fellow at the Institute for National Security Studies. From 2001 to 2007, Amb. Stein served as Israel's Ambassador to Germany. Prior to this appointment, he served in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) as Deputy Director General for the CIS, as well as Eastern and Central Europe. Amb. Stein held additional MFA posts in Washington, Germany, and Israel, and was a member of Israel's delegation to multilateral negotiations on arms control. He is also an international consultant, working for American, German, and Israeli organizations. He publishes articles regularly in the German press on foreign and security issues.



Gen. (ret.) Haim Tomer Former Chief of International Operational Division, Prime Minister's Office (PMO)

Gen. (ret.) Haim Tomer is a strategic consultant for Israeli and non-Israeli companies, firms and governmental agencies. Before that, he was consultant for leading cyber-intelligence companies, a member of the AWZ ventures investment fund, and chairman of The Fifth Dimension start-up. Until 2014, he was chief of the International Operational Division (General rank), and Chief of the Intelligence Division (personal intelligence officer of the Israeli Prime Minister). Before that, he headed the counter-terrorism directorate and held various staff and field positions in Israel and overseas at the PMO. From 1973 to 1981, he completed the Israeli Defence Force service and from 1981 to 1987, he was Army Reserve Battalion Commander at the Israeli Defense Force. He obtained a BA in Middle Eastern studies from Tel Aviv University in 1985 and completed a senior management studies within the PMO.



Col. (ret.) Rami Yungman

Deputy Head, Policy & Political Military Bureau; Director for International Cooperation, Ministry of Defense (MoD)

Rami Yungman is the Deputy Head of the Policy & Political Military Bureau and Director for International Cooperation at the Ministry of Defense. In this capacity, he is responsible for policy planning & implementation, defense cooperation and strategic dialogues. Since he joined the MoD in 1996, he has been involved in strategic policy planning and international cooperation. In 1972, he started his military service in the IDF's military intelligence where he served for 24 years in various positions. He took part in the 1973 Yom Kippur War, the 1982 First Lebanon War and the 1991 Gulf War. He studied history of the Middle East and East Africa, has an MBA and is a graduate of the IDF's Brigade Commanders course, Command and Staff College and NESA's (US-NDU) Executive Seminar.





Haim Waxman Instructor, National Defense College



Lt. Col. Asaf Zarmi Representative, Strategic Planning Department, IDF

Haim Waxman is the head of foreign affairs studies in the Israel National Defense College, where he has been serving in the past three years as an instructor. A career diplomat, Mr. Waxman was Israel's Deputy Permanent Representative to the United Nations from 2010 to 2013. Prior to that posting, he served as the Director of the Department for Non-Proliferation in the Strategic Affairs Division of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA). While heading the Department for Defense Export Controls in the MFA between 2005 and 2007, Mr. Waxman was closely involved in the reform of the national system of export controls and legislation. Mr. Waxman served as counsellor at the Permanent Mission of Israel to the United Nations office in Geneva from 1999 until 2004. He holds a BA in Russian and General studies from the Hebrew University Jerusalem (1990) and an MA in public policy from Tel Aviv University (2005).

Lt. Col. Asaf Zarmi works in the Strategic Division of the IDF's Planning Directorate. Before he started to deal with the complexity of the strategic viewpoint, he started his military career in the Planning Directorate's Operations Research, dealing primarily with issues related to force buildup. He then moved to be an intelligence officer in the Israel Defense Intelligence (IDI) Research Division. Lt. Col. Zarmi received his M.Sc. in applied mathematics from Tel Aviv University.

Dr. Marwan Abou-Taam Analyst, State Criminal Investigation Department, Rhineland-Palatinate; Research Associate, Berlin Institute for Integration and Migration Research (BIM)

Dr. Marwan Abou-Taam is a scholar of Islamic studies and political science. Born in Beirut (Lebanon), he took his PhD under Bassam Tibi at the University of Göttingen, submitting a dissertation on Islamist terrorism. He works at the Landeskriminalamt (LKA), the State Criminal Investigation Department of Rhineland-Palatinate, with a focus on Islamist extremism, Salafism/ Jihadism, and internal security. Dr. Marwan Abou-Taam is an associated member of the Institut für empirische Integrations- und Migrationsforschung (BIM), the Berlin Institute for Integration and Migration Research at the Humboldt University Berlin. Since 2014, he has also been a visiting lecturer at the University of Applied Sciences.



Amb. Dr. Philipp Ackermann Regional Director for the Near and Middle East and the North Africa, Federal Foreign Office

Amb. Dr. Philipp Ackermann has been the Regional Director for the Near and Middle East and the North Africa at the Federal Foreign Office in Berlin since August 2016. Before that, he was Minister and Deputy Chief of Mission at the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany in Washington, D.C. From 2010 to 2014, he held the position as Head of Task Force Afghanistan-Pakistan in the Federal Foreign Office and as German Deputy Special Representative for Afghanistan and Pakistan. Several other postings have been to Rabat (Morocco), New York (German mission to the UN) and New Delhi (India). Between 2002 and 2006, Amb. Dr. Ackermann worked in the offices of the Federal Foreign Ministers Joschka Fischer and Frank-Walter Steinmeier. From 2006 to 2007, he headed the German Provincial Reconstruction Team in Kunduz, Afghanistan. He studied art history and economics in Bonn, Heidelberg and Utrecht, and received his doctorate in art history in 1993.





Dr. Wilfried Buchta Independent Political Analyst and Middle East Consultant



Judy Dempsey Editor-In-Chief, *Strategic Europe*, Carnegie Europe

Dr. Wilfried Buchta is a political analyst and Middle East consultant. He was engaged as a senior political affairs officer by the United Nations Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI) in providing expertise and assistance to the Government of Iraq (2005–2011). He was based in Baghdad liaising with leading Iraqi politicians, officials and clerics. Prior to this, Dr. Buchta's publications placed him into a small circle of leading world experts on the politics of the Islamic Republic of Iran, e.g. Who Rules Iran? The Structure of Power in the Islamic Republic (2000). Dr. Buchta gives lectures and has served as a consultant for a number of state and non-governmental institutions, such as the UN Department for Political Affairs (DPA) in New York, the German Bertelsmann-Foundation, the SPD-affiliated Friedrich-Ebert-Foundation (FES) and the Geneva Centre for Democratic Control of Armed Forces (DCAF). Dr. Buchta studied Islamic studies, political science and religious studies at the Friedrich-Wilhelm-University Bonn and received his PhD in 1997. He is also a certified translator for Arabic and Persian.

Judy Dempsey has been a senior fellow at Carnegie Europe and editor-in-chief of Carnegie's Strategic Europe since 2012. Prior to that, she was a columnist for the International New York Times after serving as the International Herald Tribune's Germany Correspondent in Berlin between 2004 to 2011. From 2001 to 2004, she was the Financial Times' Diplomatic Correspondent in Brussels covering the NATO and European Union enlargements. Between 1996 and 2001, she was the FT's Jerusalem bureau chief, its Berlin correspondent from 1992 to 1996 and its Eastern European correspondent from 1990 to 1992. During the 1980s, Dempsey reported from Vienna on Central and Eastern Europe for the Financial Times, the Irish *Times,* and the *Economist*. She graduated from Trinity College, Dublin, where she studied history and political science. She has contributed to several books on Eastern Europe. In 2013, her book on Chancellor Angela Merkel Das Phänomen Merkel was published. She has been awarded several journalism prizes.



Dr. Fritz Felgentreu MdB Member, Defense Committee (2013–2017); Member, Committee on Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth (2013–17)

Dr. Fritz Felgentreu MdB has been the deputy spokesman on defense policy of the SPD parliamentary group since May 2015. Being a member of the German Bundestag since September 2013, he is a member of the Defense Committee and the Committee on Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth. In addition, Dr. Felgentreu MdB acts as secretary at plenary sittings. From 2001 until 2011, Dr. Felgentreu MdB was a member of the Berlin House of Representatives, deputy chairman of the SPD parliamentary group and spokesman on legal policy affairs. Since 2014, he is deputy chairman of the German Bundestag's working group on reservist affairs and chairman of the Berlin national association of the German War Graves Commission. Furthermore, Dr. Felgentreu MdB is member of the executive committee of the German Atlantic Association and chairman of the German-Moldovan Forum since November 2015.



Dr. Richard Herzinger Political Correspondent and Columnist, *Die Welt* and *Die Welt am Sonntag*

Dr. Richard Herzinger is political correspondent and columnist for Die Welt and Welt am Sonntag in Berlin, focusing on international politics (Middle East, EU, Ukraine-Russia, transatlantic relations). Between 2004 and 2005, he worked as German correspondent for the Swiss weekly Die Weltwoche. From 1996 to 2004, he was working as author and editor for the weekly *Die Zeit* in Hamburg. He wrote numerous articles and essays for German and international newspapers and magazines, among others Internationale Politik, Jüdische Allgemeine, Foreign Policy, and Neue Zürcher Zeitung. He is author of several books on western liberalism and anti-western ideology, among them Endzeitproheten oder Die Offensive der Antiwestler (1995, with Hannes Stein), and Republik ohne Mitte (2001). He achieved a PhD in German literature in 1991 and lectured for several years at the Free University of Berlin.





Amb. Prof. Dr. Hans-Dieter Heumann Director, Center for International Security and Governance (CISG), University Bonn; former President of the Federal Academy for Security Policy (BAKS)

Ambassador (ret.) Dr. Hans-Dieter Heumann is Director at the Center for International Security and Governance (CISG) of the University of Bonn. He is the former President of BAKS in Berlin and a former Ambassador of Germany (to the Council of Europe). He served in both the policy planning staffs of the German Foreign Office and the German Ministry of Defense as well as at the German embassies in Washington D.C., Moscow and Paris. In Washington D.C. he taught at Georgetown University. His areas of expertise include international relations and security, European security, US foreign policy, Russia. His publications focus on these issues.



Christiane Hoffmann Deputy Head, Berlin Office, SPIEGEL

Christiane Hoffmann is the Deputy Head of the Berlin Office of German news magazine *SPIEGEL*. She is a specialist on Foreign and Security Policy. From 1994 to 2002, she was with *Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung* and *Frankfurter Allgemeine Sonntagszeitung*, among other postings she was a correspondent to Moscow from 1996 to 1999, Tehran from 1999 to 2004 and Berlin from 2009 to 2014. Christiane Hoffmann is the author of a book on Iran *Hinter den Schleiern Irans* (Behind the veils of Iran). She is married to Swiss diplomat and politician Tim Guldimann and has two daughters.



Dr. Rüdiger Huth Deputy Director General, Security & Defense Policy Matters, Federal Ministry of Defense (FMOD)
