

BRIGADIER GENERAL STEVEN J. DEMILLIANO

Brig. Gen. Steven J. deMilliano serves as the Deputy Director, Strategy, Engagement, and Programs Directorate, United States Africa Command, Stuttgart-Mohringen, Germany. In this capacity, General deMilliano assists the Director in crafting strategy and policy; integrating international and African partner military efforts on the continent; and conducting a wide range of U.S. interagency and international engagements to achieve the commander's priorities throughout the U.S. Africa Command Area of Responsibility.

General deMilliano entered the U.S. Air Force after graduating with a degree in Electrical Engineering from Northwestern University, where he received his commission through the Reserve Officers' Training Corps. He is a Distinguished Graduate of pilot training and F-15 training, and is an F-15 Weapons School graduate. He has served numerous operational assignments in Air Combat Command, U.S. Air Forces Europe, and Pacific Air Forces, as well as on the air staff at the National Guard Bureau, and joint assignments as Vice Director of Operations J3 and Operations Directorate Division Chief at Headquarters North American Aerospace Defense Command. Prior to his current



position, General deMilliano was the Commander of the 176th Wing at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska.
