







As a narrative of exile and return

As a set of wars: Why are wars effective in national narratives?

1948-1949 War of Independence: PL, Egypt, Jordan, Syria, Iraq,

1956-7: Suez War: Egypt

1967 Six Day War: Egypt, Syria, Jordan, Iraq

1967-1970 War of Attrition: Egypt. Also: USSR

1973: Egypt, Syria, Iraq,Also: Morocco, North Korea, Saudi Arabia, Libya

1982: PLO, Syria


2. How the idea was implemented: Centralized, socialist, communal, and in the context of conflict







Israel ethnic composition (2020*)




The Pale of Settlement

Universalist deliverance


We still believe, or many of us do, what the Exodus first taught about the meaning and possibility of politics and about its proper form: First; that wherever you live, it is probably Egypt; second; that there is a better place, a world more attractive, a promised land; and third, that the way to the land is through the wilderness. There is no way to get from here to there except by joining together and marching." - Michael Walzer













Zionism: elements of revolution

- Led by socialists
- National, economic, and personal transformation
- Willingness to break old traditions
- Counter revolution and synthesis
- Many different dream for deliverance

So What is Zionism?



Zionism (Zion=Jerusalem/the land of Israel)

- 1. A Jewish nationalt movement
- 2. Goal the creation and support of a Jewish national state in Erezt-Yisrael/Palestine

Internal view: Builds on the centrality of Israel in Judaism as interwoven into Jewish life



(Jewish ritual) three pilgrimage festivals (Sukkot, Passover, and Shavuot)

But, also a modern national movement

- Born in the context of 19th century Central/Eastern Europe
